NAT GEO UK Shoots at ACA



Amman Civil Airport was chosen by National Geographic Channel, and in coordination with the Royal Film Commission – Jordan, as one of the preferred locations to shoot some scenes of **“Escape from Tehran”** which is an episode of the world renowned Locked-Up Abroad documentary program.

Locked-Up Abroad (previously known as Banged-Up Abroad) is a documentary television series featuring stories of people who have been arrested while travelling abroad; it takes the viewers inside firsthand accounts of capture, imprisonment, and pure terror far from home.

The scenes that were shot at the arrivals and departures terminals, tells a story about a rescue mission of six American diplomats who had evaded capture during the seizure of the United States embassy in Tehran, and taking of embassy personnel as hostages in 1979.

Amman Civil Airport - Marka (ACA)
 Strategically located in close proximity to the center of Amman, 3 km from the city center, ACA serves as a main civil airport for passengers on chartered flights and VIP private flights, and moreover as an aviation education and training hub.

VIP Facilities
 JAC has executed the project of renovating and managing the VIP lounge located at the Airport which was delivered in January 2012. The company is operating the lounge with a new spirit and a new level of services to make it one of the most exceptional VIP terminals in the region. The project includes:

- The Main Lounge overlooking the Airport Apron
- Private Lounge for Head of States and Visitors of the Royal Court
- Meeting Room / fully equipped for VIP Lounge Visitors use
- Business Center / Crew Briefing Room / Crew Rest Hotel Rooms

Airport Upgrade Plan

- Comprehensive master plan for the Airport has been prepared by international consultants and will be executed on phases
- Entrance rehabilitation already started on site and scheduled to be delivered in Mid 2013
- The tender to upgrade, enhance and operate the duty free shops at the terminals of the Airport has been awarded to ALDEASA and construction works is scheduled to start in Mid 2013
- The final designs of the Airport Facades and Arrivals Terminal are revealed and the construction works is scheduled to start in May 2013

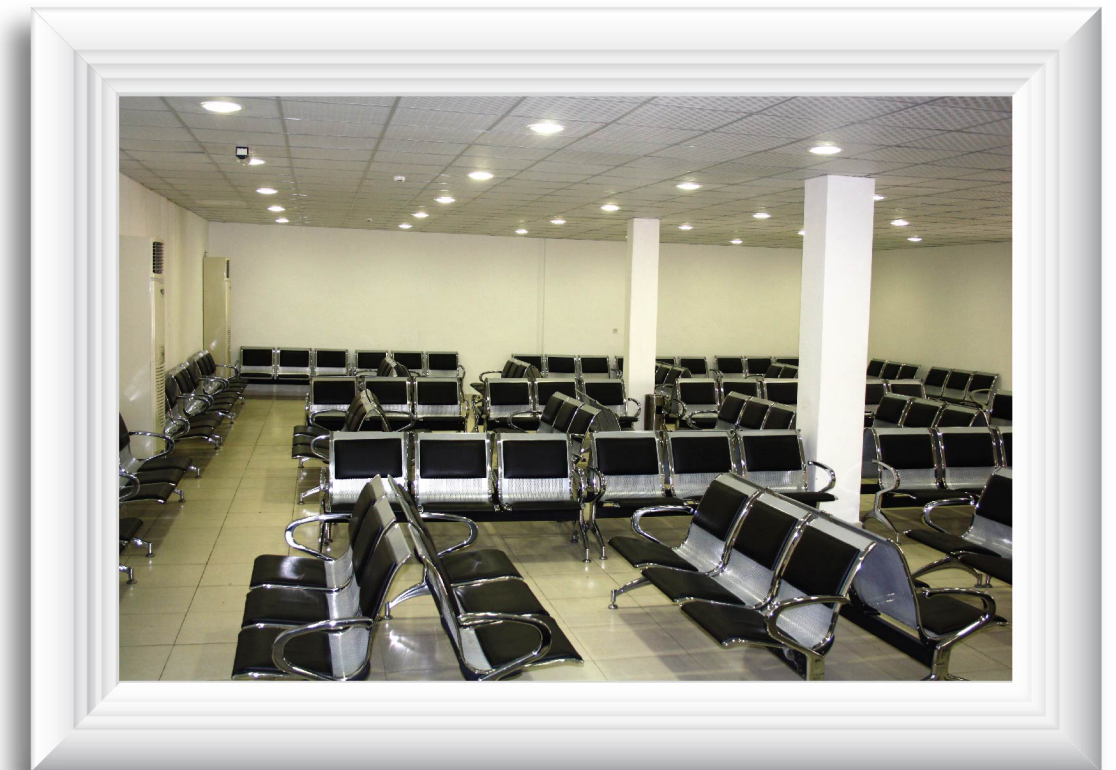

New **Transit Hall**

To enhance the air traffic movement at Amman Civil Airport and as part of the airport upgrade plan; the company has developed a Transit Hall with a total area of 300 m² fitted with 250 seats and other facilities. The hall was upgraded internally in collaborative efforts of many sections and departments within the company.

The company commenced transit operations at the newly developed hall during the 4th Quarter of 2012 and currently it accommodates on average 3 daily flights. We believe that the overall operations of the hall will create a market position for the air transit movement at airport on the long term.



Committees & Training Programs

To implement the requirements of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) Jordan Airports Company established the following committees and training programs:

Airport Operations & Facilitations Committee :

The Committee consists of all companies and security authorities operating in the airport. The Committee meets every month to improve the airport facilities, ensure airport security, review all facets of the airport activities and provides advice and counsel to the Board of Directors on any relevant matter.

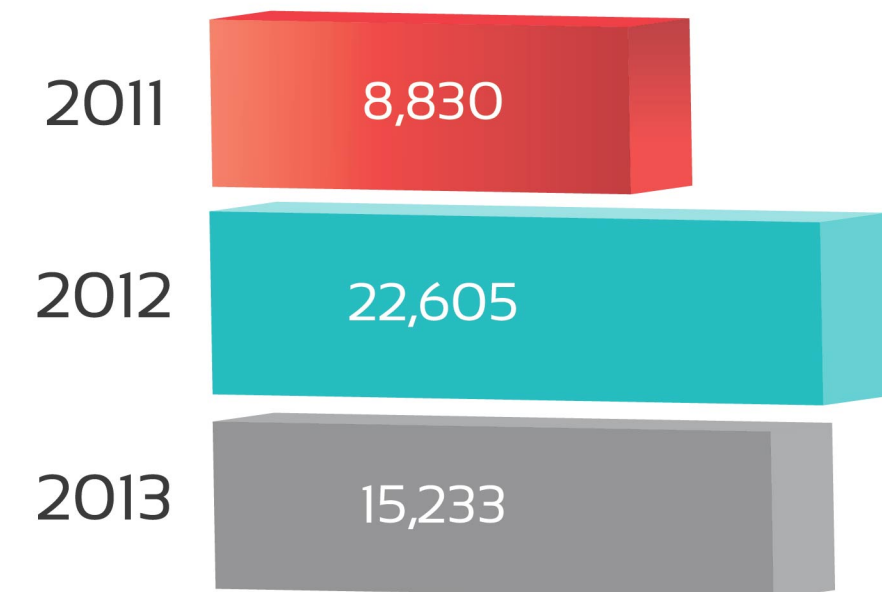
Airport Safety Committee :

The Committee meets every three months to review safety in the airside areas. The Committee consists of all organizations that operate in airside areas, such as different aerodrome divisions, airlines, handling agents, aircraft catering companies, aircraft cleaning companies, refueling companies, ATC, government agencies and emergency response services.

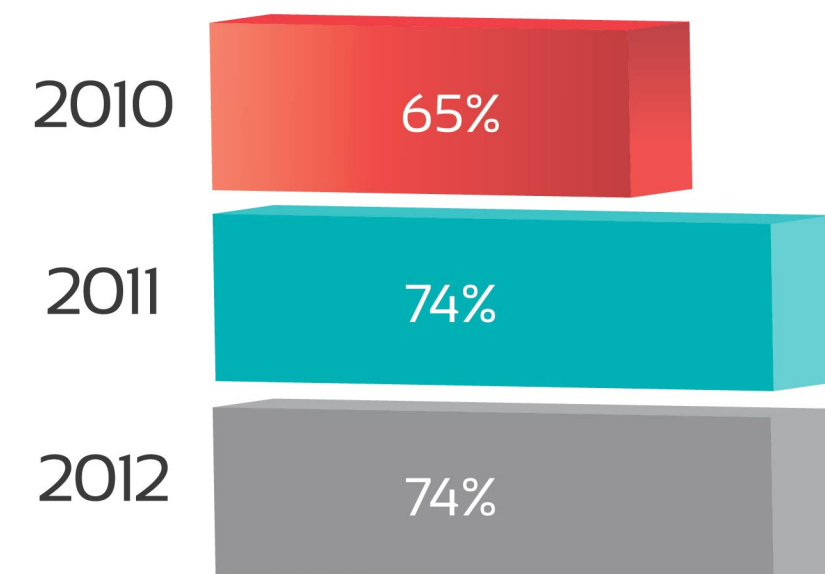
Vehicle operations on the Air Operations Area :
