In an interview with Alarab Alyawm Newspaper; the General Manager of Jordan Airports Company, Mr. Ramzi Batarseh highlighted the following:

- "ACA will have a complementary and supporting role to Queen Alia International Airport"
- "The number of passengers in ACA will reach one million over the next five years"
- "By the years 2015-2016 the training academies will be transferred to a new location to accommodate their increasing business"
- "The Master Plan for the airport offers a perspective of the airport for 20 years"
- "1.2 million dinars, the company's revenues during the first quarter of the year 2013 recording 7% growth over last year"
- "Some of the important projects for the coming years will be a new asphalt layer for the runway and taxiways at a cost of 3.5 million Jordanian Dinars and an expansion plan for the car parking to accommodate 350 extra cars"

IATA Selected Amman Civil Airport to Implement a New Global Initiative

The international Air Transport Association (IATA) selected Amman Civil Airport to implement a new global initiative on jet fuel quantity assurance on 30th April 2013.

As part of this initiative, leading inspectors from IATA Fuel Quantity Pool (IFQP) and the jet fuel industry's Joint Inspection Group (JIG) to undertake a trial joint inspection which will be the first formal joint assessment between the airline and supplier industry inspection groups.


The objective of this trial will be to look at the synergy between the inspection groups and determine opportunity for expanding the covering of jet fuel inspection across similar airports. As such it will also be important to determine the benefits of such inspections for airports similar to Amman Civil Airport.



Cargo Inspection Center

JAC has been selected by the Ministry of Transport to manage the new state-of-the-art cargo inspection facility at Queen Alia International Airport (QAIA). The facility was a grant from the People of Japan through the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to the People of Jordan. The new \$8-million facility will be able to inspect cargo shipped through QAIA in a much safer and faster manner than using traditional X-ray machines. Official operation is expected during September of this year






Occupational Health and Safety Awareness


As we are committed to providing a safe workplace for our employees and raise occupational health and safety awareness, a three days Work Injury workshop has been undertaken at Amman Civil Airport between 09 - 11 Jun 2013 in coordination with Jordanian Social Security Corporation.

Fifty nine personnel has been targeted from maintenance and engineering divisions in which the work conditions are demanding high risk while performing essential duties.

The workshop highlighted the physical and mechanical hazards causes; protection procedures against potential injuries and social security's polices implementation at Jordanian organizations. Many frequent work accidents cases were discussed to enhancing safety culture through the employees positive behavior.
